

Help us help you when you call 911

by taking these steps:

- ✓ Sign up for Smart911 at www.smart911.com to share information with 911 and first responders to help you in an emergency.
- ✓ Be sure your address is visible from the road.
- Clear pathways inside and outside the home.
- ✓ Lock up pets Secure them in a room with a closed door before firefighters arrive.
- ✓ If possible, unlock your front door or send someone out to meet firefighters at the road.
- ✓ Have a list of current medications, a medical history, and list of emergency contacts on your refrigerator.
- If you have medical directive or POLST form, have it available.

Emergency Medical Services

More than 85% of the 911 calls your firefighters respond to are medical emergencies.

Here's a look at the emergency medical services (EMS) response units staffed 24/7 to serve you.

FIREFIGHTER/PARAMEDICS

Provide advanced lifesaving care including administering IV medications and airway control

POWER STRETCHER

To smoothly load patients and reduce firefighter injuries

PEDIATRIC KIT

Equipment and supplies for treating children

DEFIBRILLATOR

To analyze heart function and administer a shock to restore a normal heartbeat

VIDEO LARYNGOSCOPE

Camera and monitor used when inserting a breathing tube to provide airway care

20 medications for serious medical conditions and injuries



Medical Services Officer

A Medical Services Officer responds to the most serious medical emergencies and carries:

- ► Whole blood for in-field transfusions for trauma injuries.
- ► A mechanical device to provide consistent CPR chest compressions.
- ► An antidote kit for treating smoke inhalation patients.
- ▶ Extra EMS supplies and equipment.



Community Paramedic

Sometimes 911 callers need more than a trip to the hospital for help.

A Community Paramedic provides nonemergency assistance to help frequent 911 callers access social services and resources.

In addition to helping patients and their loved ones, the Community Paramedic program has reduced 911 calls and emergency room visits.



Fire Engine or Ladder Truck

These rigs are staffed by firefighters trained and equipped to provide EMS care. A fire engine or ladder responds to an EMS call:

- ▶ If it's closest to the call location. The crew can begin treatment and an ambulance will respond too if you need to go to the hospital.
- ► For serious emergencies requiring a team of responders. For example, cardiac arrest requires at least nine firefighters to perform high-performance CPR.



Volunteer Firefighter Support team recruiting members

We are recruiting for our Volunteer Firefighter Support program through May 30. This program engages members of the community to provide critical support services to personnel responding to fires and other emergencies. Volunteer Firefighter Support staff drive and operate AIR15, a highly specialized emergency apparatus capable of refilling air bottles needed at fires. Members also assist with community outreach and education activities.

Preparing for disasters

The Cascadia Subduction Zone, located off the coast of Washington, can produce large earthquakes reaching magnitude 9 or higher. For the PNW, this would be "The Big One." The recent earthquake in Turkey demonstrates how earthquakes can collapse structures impacting communities.

The good news is that progressive revisions of national and regional building codes have improved the likelihood that structures built in the last 10 years will survive a significant quake. South County Fire firefighters prepare for and train in specialized technical rescue disciplines, including confined space and structural collapse rescue, essential skills needed during an earthquake response.

Operating in austere
environments without
electricity, communications,
and other essential services
has motivated me to teach
others disaster preparedness
skills to better prepare the
public in case of disaster.

Now is the time to prepare, not when the ground begins to shake. Mitigating your risk from the effects of a major earthquake is the key to insulating you and your family. Prepare by storing non-perishable food, medications, extra eyeglasses, and clothes in a "Go Bag." Essential skills are also needed to protect your family and help your neighbors during an emergency.

Free training from South County Fire to help you prepare

South County Fire provides free training in life-saving skills and specific courses that prepare you for disasters. Our 1-hour, online disaster preparedness class provides a basic introduction to get you started on a preparedness kit and plan. Register and learn more on our website: www. southsnofire.org/classes.

For those who want more in-depth training, South County Fire offers Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training twice a year. This program teaches essential lifesaving skills needed to help you, your family and neighbors until emergency responders arrive: fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations.
