

HOW EMERGENCY SERVICES ARE FUNDED

Fire Levy

EMS Levy

Benefit Charge

- Voters approved in 2020
- Annual fee based on building size, use and risk
- Not a property tax
- Reduces maximum fire levy by a third

MINIMUM FIREFIGHTERS: 22



UNITS DISPATCHED: 16

MINIMUM FIREFIGHTERS: 34





























WHAT DOES IT COST ME?

When voters first approved the benefit charge in 2020, more than 95 percent of homeowners paid

THE SAME OR LESS

than what they paid before.



In 2024,

the owner of a 2,000-square-foot home pays a yearly benefit charge of \$71.64.





RENEWING THE BENEFIT CHARGE WILL:

- Maintain response times
- Maintain service levels
- Fund firefighter training
- Fund emergency response equipment
